## NJ SCI Survey Statewide Overall Domain Rankings: 2023-2024 School Year



Aggregated, de-identified data from the NJ SCI Survey were analyzed to identify school climate strengths and areas of need based on statewide overall means on <u>survey domains</u> (ranked from highest to lowest) across respondent groups for the 2023-2024 school year. The sample consists of over 123,700 students, staff, and parents/caregivers from 312 schools and 72 districts, representing 20 out of 21 counties. Although the sample is well distributed in terms of the demographics of the respondents, the findings are not intended to be regarded as representative as they are derived from a limited sample during one school year. This information is presented to help schools have a general indication of which of these areas are perceived as a strength or area of need among others in the state using the survey, and to help inform communication about data and support the

process of selecting areas to improve in school climate goals using NJ SCI data. As data are collected over time from a wider sample, the possibility of providing state-wide benchmarking data will be explored.
